Greetings TBCS,




We have been hopping this week as many of our units are nearing the end, and we are preparing for the final tests to be written. This week all students wrote their final test of the Science unit on Forest Communities. The next unit we begin will be a Social Studies unit entitled "Canada and Its Trading Partners" We will also do some work in the next month on "Victorian Christmas".
