# From The Principal's Desk:

Greetings TBCS,

As you are aware our school will be producing **The Lion, The Witch, and the Wardrobe** this year. The Newsletter that is going home today has a one page listing of different props and costumes we will need. I would also like to take this time to communicate a few more details regarding this play.

- 1. This performance will include all students.
  - a. **Actors** (Grade 5-10) –students not comfortable with acting will be involved in one or more of the following areas:
    - i. Set design (painting and constructing)
    - ii. Costumes creators
    - iii. Helpers for make-up
    - iv. Behind the scenes managers to help ensure everyone is where they need to be at the right moment.
  - b. **Animals**: Good and Bad (Grade 1-4) there will be no speaking parts, at times they will be frozen due to the Witch's power, but once they are free they will battle with bad animals in the final showdown between the Witch and Aslan
  - c. **Mice** (JK/SK) they will be given white gloves and through the use of black lights it will appear that they will be eating the ropes that have bound Aslan.
- 2. All work (Sets/Costumes) and practices will take place during school hours (Class time). Since this production will be a lot of work, it was decided that this would take the place of assemblies.



## Grade 1 & 2 – Miss Rekman

**Bible:** We will be reading the stories of Jonah and the end of the kingdom of Israel (2 Kings 17). Our memory work is Psalm 103:8 For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his love for those who fear him."

**Math:** We will end our units on geometry and measurement with a quiz on November 6. Students should be able to identify different 2D and 3D shapes, measure in centimeters, and compare length.

## **Grade 5 & 6** – Mrs. Himanen

I can't believe how quickly this week and the month of October flew by! Already it is November and soon the snow will be on the ground! This week we continued working through the various subject areas: In P.E. we enjoyed playing new games that I learned at a workshop at the convention. In math the grade sixes began the next chapter called "Data Management" (graphing) and the grade fives wrote their test on chapter 2 "Numeration". We learned about convex and concave lenses in Science (ask you son/daughter what trick we used to remember how they are shaped) In Bible we studied the organization of the Bible. We learned about the Hebrew and Greek languages and continued to memorize the categories and the books of the Bible in order. Students handed in their first set of written book reports, and I have been so impressed with the way they have done these.

Good work, class! We also got a chance to experience how committees work through the "decision making process" by bringing forth a motion, carrying out discussion on the motion, and voting on the motion. We did this to come up with our Bazaar Box idea. The theme that was decided upon was "Sweet Treats". Delicious sweet treats in the range of \$10-\$15 (ie. chocolates, candies, drink mixes etc.) can be sent in to be put in our classroom box which will be auctioned off at the Bazaar in November.

## Grade 7 & 8 - Mr. Himanen, Mr. Alblas, Miss Baxter

**Bazaar Boxes**- Each of your children has signed up for a bazaar box idea. Please ask them what they have signed up for and start looking around for different options.

**History:** Next week the class will be learning about the War of 1812. The students will be learning about the reasons that the war with the United States started, and how the colonies of Upper and Lower Canada responded to the American attacks.

**Geography**: The class will be studying the different animals that live in the coniferous forest biome, and how God has given these animals special characteristics that allow them to survive in the sometimes harsh climate of this biome.

**Bible**: The class will be having their unit test on the Singer next week on Thursday November 7. Students need to remember all the symbolism found in this story, and what it means to them.

**Gr. 8 Guitar:** The class will be having their playing test on Monday November 4. Students can pick any song that we have played so far this year to show that they know their chords, and that they can play a strumming pattern.

**Art:** The students are developing their skills in colour mixing. The students are each painting a smaller piece of a bigger painting. Make sure to come see the larger painting pieced together in the front hallway.

**Language Arts**: Students are busy working away on book projects. You should see some projects coming home this weekend to be worked on, as they are due on Monday, November 4th. Students have four major book projects throughout the year and they have the option to opt out of one. I have stressed that they must be on top of their reading so that they do not get behind. Please check out the blog website that I have set up. All the instructions and a marking scheme for their book reports and projects are listed on that blog. I am hoping to set up the presentations and their explanations in the library or the front hallway for parents and peers to view the work. We will be doing reading conferences next week. Students will be asked to read a passage and I will record them. I will provide them with feedback and we will set a goal for their reading. The students are now exploring the idea of point of view. What types of point of view appear in different types of writing? What is the purpose for using different types of point of view?

**Math**: There will be a math test for Grade 7 and 8 next week Friday on Geometry. Please ensure your child reviews the terms at home, and it would be beneficial to review their textbook as well.

#### Grade 9 & 10 – Miss Baxter, Mrs. Vortman, Mr. Himanen, Mrs. Hawkins

**Bazaar Boxes**- Each of your children has signed up for a bazaar box idea. Please ask them what they have signed up for and start looking around for different options.

**Bible**: The students are learning the fine art of working within a group. Sometimes this can be difficult and sometimes frustrating but it is a key skill that will be used throughout their lives. They are working on creating a bulletin board on Paul's missionary journey. Things are coming together so

feel free to come and visit to take a look.

**English**: Well, we are finally finished our first book together. The students will view the film version of the book, *To Kill a Mockingbird*, after writing their final test. We are also working on developing their first essay of the year. Make sure to check in with your children to see what they are working on and what topic they have chosen for their essays. The most difficult part of writing an essay is developing the thesis. We will work on this next week, time

permitting.

**AVIO:** Students explored the works of different scratchboard artists and started planning their own work.

### **Music** – Mrs. Hawkins

**Grade 1-2:** Students learned new songs this week.

**Grade 3-4:** Students are doing very well with their recorders. They are continuing to learn "Simple Gifts".

**Grade 5-6:** Please bring your ukes to school on Thursday so I can tune them for Friday's class. Please practice ukulele chords from group one and group two for next week.

**Grade 7 Band:** Students have learned their fourth note this week. We will have another playing test on page 8 next Wednesday. Students will be asked to play "Mary Had a Little Lamb" and one other melody of their choice.
