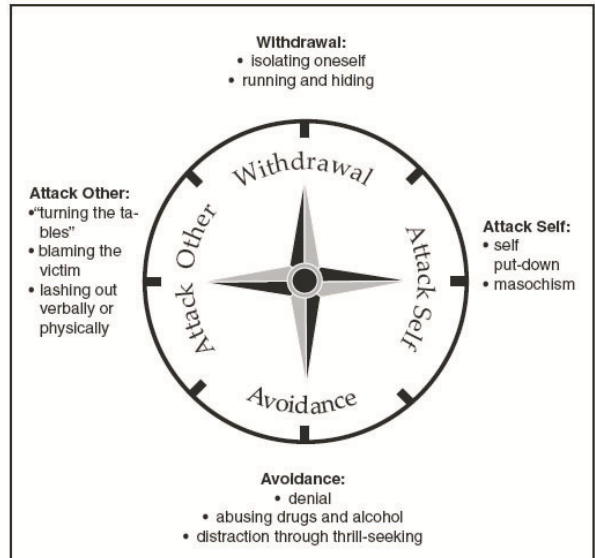
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**From The Principal's Desk:**

Greetings TBCS,

An important tenet of the Restorative Justice Script is the exploration and admission of harm caused. Indeed, if a wrong doer does not admit to harm caused, restorative intervention will not take place. Admission of harm caused will, however, lead to a disruption of positive affect, hence Shame. This Shame is an essential aspect of the restorative process. Only by admitting wrongdoing can you start closing the disconnection caused by the original act of wrongdoing in the first place. Shaming is not an act of humiliation, which by its very nature is punitive, but instead a temporary "exilement" of the offender in order for them to be allowed back into their community as whole. The diagram to the right explains different forms of shame one might experience or see in others.
