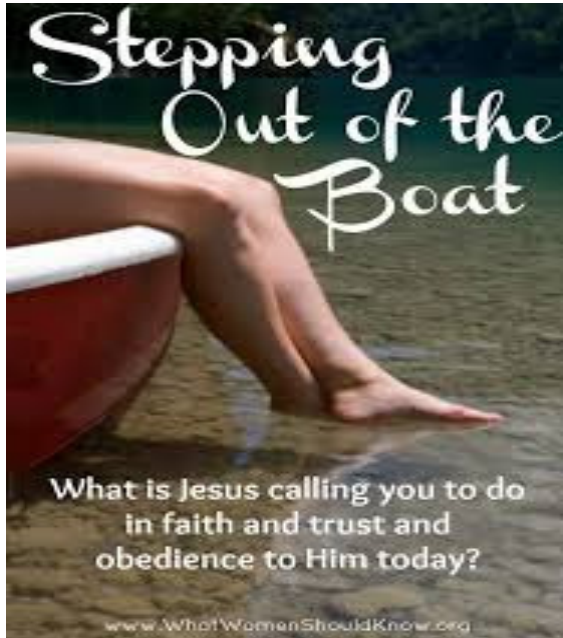

The month of October sure flew by quickly, and November is upon us! Soon the snow will be on the ground! Even though many students were excited today because of Halloween, we were able to remember and learn about a more important day for Christians: Reformation Day. We are thankful for those who led the Reformation so that we could know that it is not by works, but by faith in Jesus Christ, that we are saved.

Today we enjoyed "Backwards Day"! We had fun wearing our clothes backwards and doing things in a backwards way. We completed the subjects of our day backwards and even turned the time backwards as we had lunch in the JK/SK class and remembered what it was like "back" in the good old days!

In math both classes began a new unit on Data Management (graphing). In P.E. we spent time playing indoor soccer and learning how to throw and catch a football. For many this was the first time they had ever thrown a football! Everyone did very well! We completed some C.T.B.S. tests and talked about "growing pains" in Literature. In Bible we finished studying Psalms of Penitence. We saw how David was genuinely sorry for his sin, admitted his fault, and accepted the consequences of his actions. He also learned from his mistake and went forward seeking to follow God more closely.

We also discussed and deliberated on what Bazaar Box theme to go with. Students presented their ideas, discussed the merits of each idea, and then voted several times until a majority was reached. The theme that was decided upon is "Around the World". Think of items that different countries are known for and those things can be purchased for our box. ie. Canada - hockey items, Holland - cheese or other Dutch food products, Italy - items to make spaghetti, China - rice cooker, etc. Let your imagination go to distant places! Remember that items of \$10-\$15 in value go into this box. You can group with another member of the class to buy a larger item or place several smaller items in that total to the value.
