Mrs. Hawkins: Music- Students were issued recorders this week. We also discussed dotted and sixteenth note patterns. Students also learned about folk song collecting and Remembrance Day songs. Please bring your recorders for Monday's class.

Grades 5 & 6 - Mrs. Himanen

The students continued working through the curriculum material this week and took some time to complete more C.T. B.S. tests. It turned out to be a much busier week than we expected, and we did not get as far as I thought we would in some areas. Therefore the test that was supposed to be written in Bible will have to be rescheduled to next week.

We loved watching the JK/SK class present their assembly to us today! Thank you for all your hard work in showing us how to have faith as small as a mustard seed. We were amazed at all the words you memorized for your songs. Great job!

Students wrote a quiz on commas this week and next week will work on identifying subject and predicate and moving the subject around to make more interesting sentences. In math both classes continued studying various graphing techniques, and the grade sixes learned about scatter plots which is a brand new concept for them. In Science we studied the concept of succession in the forest community, and the students have been excitedly working in groups to make models which display the stages of succession. It has been fun to watch them work together to create this 3-D project! In Literature we finished the unit on "Growing and Changing" in the World of Literature text and also have been working on learning more about Remembrance Day.

****Note** - I do my best to anticipate what we are able to get accomplished in a given week. Sometimes it takes longer than I expect or our schedule is interrupted for various reasons. Please remember that all test dates are subject to change and that changes are sometimes made to give the students ample opportunity to prepare and study.

Mrs. Hawkins: Music- Students will have a playing test next week. Grade 5 can play "He's Got the Whole World" or "Clementine", while Grade 6 will play "Eensie, Weensie Spider".

Grades 7 & 8 - Mr. Himanen, Mrs. Voortman, Mrs. Hawkins

Mr. Himanen: History- The class is coming to the end of their unit on the Reformation, so we will be having our unit test next week on Friday, November 14. We will be reviewing the material covered in class the days prior to the test.

Students will need to remember the key characters involved in the Reformation as well as the key issues that resulted the Reformation occurring.

Science -The class has been in the science lab performing a number of different experiments and activities to show how God has created different chemicals to react with other chemicals. We will continue with some more experiments next week as we learn about different kinds of reactions.

Bible- The class is studying the book of Proverbs and looking at how the wise words found in that book of the Bible can, and should, be applied to our lives today.

Geography- We will be continuing our study of the country of Brazil next week. We will be looking at how the country has changed from its early history, and the difficulties that it presently faces.

Mrs. Voortman: Math- We just finished unit 3 today with a test. Look for tests and unit grade summaries to be coming home early next week. We will begin unit 4 on perimeter and area.
