From the Classrooms:

JK & SK - Mrs. Kaemingh

The Kindergarten schedule will be altered slightly the first week of June to accommodate the T.B.C.S. Field Day and raindate. Our schedule for that particular week will be Monday, June 1 –SK only and then Wednesday, June 3 & **Thursday**, **June 4** – JK& SK. (There will not be any school for the Kindergarten class on Friday, June 5.)

The SK class has been introduced and has had a number of opportunities to tying shoe laces. They have made great progress and we will continue to practice this as the year draws to a close.

During our Wednesday and Friday Phys. Ed classes we have begun practicing for the many field day events. If possible, please have your child wear runners for his/her safety. Thank you!

Grades 1 & 2 - Miss Rekman

Bible: This week we studied some of the miracles of Jesus and next week we will focus on some of his parables and teachings on love. We will keep learning the books of the New Testament through a song but we will also learn the verse from Mark 16:15 "He said to them 'Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation."

Math: Both grades are working hard to understand two and three digit addition. Next week we will move onto subtraction.

Reading: Students received an information page about the book talk that is due May 29. If you need an additional paper that outlines the project please send a note to school. This day will also be the last "Special Reading and Writing Day" of the year.

Science: Next week we will start to learn about the Earth and what is inside of it. Students should be ready for a short quiz on Tuesday on the features of water and air.

Mrs. Hawkins: Music- Students sang frog songs and wrote frog jokes this week.

Grades 3 & 4 - Miss de Haan

Both grades completed a Spelling Review test and the Grade 3's also completed a Math test. The final Word Wall Review will include all words from T-Z. Due to the short week next week, the test will be the following week.

No Mad Minute packs are coming home today. I am encouraging all students to be working on the final book report.

Highlights this week:

*Grade 3's completed a test on Multiplication and started a unit on Division. Grade 4's have also moved onto division.

*In Bible, we read about David's sinfulness with Bathsheba and acted out a Reader's Theatre depicting the parable Nathan told King David. We also talked about Ascension Day.

*In Literature, we read about "Walking the Road to Freedom" based on the true story of a slave during the 1800's, Sojourner Truth.

*In Social Studies, each student has been assigned a different Australian animal. We have spent some time this week researching and are now in the process of completing a small booklet.

Please note: We have begun practicing for Field Day which will be taking place at the beginning of June. Please remind your child to bring running shoes to school on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Mrs. Hawkins: Music- Students spent time composing variations on Hot Cross Buns for their recorders this week.

Grades 5 & 6 - Mrs. Himanen

This week, students in both classes wrote tests in literature and spelling, and the grade fives wrote a chapter test in math. We started a new novel study in literature on the book called *Underground to Canada*. Students are working through this book by participating in Literature Circles. So far the groups have been reading the selections together and working on their role sheets. Next week discussion and sharing of material will occur during group meetings. For each set of reading times, students will change roles so that by the end of the book they will have had the opportunity to participate in every role and to lead the group as Discussion Director. After each meeting, students will also have an opportunity to fill in peer evaluations so they can monitor how they have been functioning in the group setting.

In math, the grade sixes have been zipping through the preliminary material on fractions and will be ready for a test next week on the material covered so far. The grade fives will also begin learning about fractions and will learn about equivalent fractions, cross products, and solving equations using cross products with equivalent fractions.

In gym we worked on track and field skills and then enjoyed playing ringette which was new and exciting for the grade fives.

In science we learned about the respiratory system and the digestive system. We have really been enjoying this unit on the human body! There will be a test next week on the circulatory, respiratory, and digestive systems.

The grade sixes have begun their sessions learning about Human Sexuality. A letter was sent home earlier this week describing the program and the book that is being used to teach this material. Please let me know if you did not receive this letter.
