### Grades 1 & 2 – Miss Boyes, Miss Strydhorst

#### Miss Boyes: Grade 1/2

Bible: We talked about the summary of the law from Matthew 22:37-39. We related this to JOY (Jesus, Others, Yourself). We also talked about the Tabernacle: the different rooms and what they held.

## Grades 7 & 8 - Mrs. Voortman, Mrs. Mol, Mr. Himanen, Mrs. Hawkins

**Mrs. Mol:**

Bible - We talked about vanity and looked through some magazines for examples of it (take a look at the wall in our classroom for the many examples the students found). We also read chapter 7 of *Dangerous Journey*.

History - We finished our "jigsaw," sharing information about the first governor of Upper Canada, John Graves Simcoe.

Writing - We learned about the characteristics and features of fables, and started getting to work planning our own. The students have come up with some great lessons to teach through their fables, and the plans for their plots are fantastic; I am SO excited to watch their plans come to life in their own children's book!

Science - The snow day foiled my plans for our science experiment to make our own thermometers. Next week!

Grade 8 Guitar - We learned the F chord and the rest of Silent Night. PLEASE practice at home (4 day weekend = no excuses)! We will continue practicing this next week, and possibly learn another Christmas song.

**Mrs. Hawkins:** Grade 7 Band- Please practice pages nine and ten for next week.

**Mme. McCutcheon:** French - Grade 7 and 8 have started their projects on basic conversation topics. They are working in small groups to teach a short lesson to the rest of the class on one topic of "small talk". Their planning phase is due Tuesday.

Words for this week are: Qui / rire / voir / salut / soleil / sud / vélo / vie / ville

**Mrs. Mol:**

Grade 9 math - We learned how to use graphing calculators to enter data and make scatter plots, and we also learned about lines of best fit, and the difference between linear and non-linear relations.

Grade 10 math - We started chapter 5 by learning how to multiply binomials using FOIL, and how to find perfect square trinomials and difference of squares.

Grade 9/10 English - We finished discussing the literary elements of *To Kill a Mockingbird*, and we also learned how to start planning for the final essay. We will be working more on this next week. Completed workbooks are due November 28 (extended from November 21, as the students have a busy week next week with geography and science).

**Mr. Himanen:**

Science - The students will be having their first unit test on Ecosystems next week on Wednesday, November 22. The test was originally scheduled for Tuesday, but because of the snow day we missed a day of review. We will review the material at the beginning of the week in preparation for the test.

Bible - The students will be completing their Genesis toledoths during the week and they will be due on Friday, November 24.

Technology - The students are learning how to take the floor plan of the houses they created in Sketchup and to make a 3 dimensional model of it using the same software program.

**Mrs. Hawkins:** Civics- Students learned about active citizenship this week.
