We learned more about the third and fourth days of creation, began working on fine tuning our fine motor skills and began working on printing and recognizing our names.

### Grade 1 – Mrs. Bolt

Language Arts: We've looked at the chunks 'an' and 'in'. It has also been fun chanting our friend's names and interviewing them.

Math: Students have been reviewing numbers from 0-10.

### Grades 2 & 3 – Mrs. Bakker, Mrs. Himanen

#### **Mrs. Bakker:**

This week was super busy learning routines and making changes as needed. :)

In Language we worked on our spelling words in many different ways! I have set up a group for our class in spelling city if you wish to have your child practice their spelling words using this tool. In Google type in spelling city and search schools. Type in Thunder Bay Christian School and select, then click on my name (Deanine Bakker). Select either games for Grade 2 - List 2 or Grade 3 - List 2 as required. We continued reading and making conclusions this week. The class really seemed to enjoy this, which was great to see. The students also spent some time with compound words and trying to remember capitals and periods when writing sentences.

Next week we will begin a type of show and tell on Monday. Students will bring in an item but can't tell anyone what it is! Writing on sentence strips, we will ask/write the presenter questions to try and guess what was brought in. Through this we will work on writing proper questions (complete, proper punctuation, capital at the beginning etc.).

Up first for Monday is Hayden, Levi, and Addison. Please bring in your secret item and keep the class guessing.

Grade Two math we worked on adding and subtracting zeros and adding tens. The students did great!

Our Bible work this week consisted of The Fall, Cain and Abel, and we began the Flood. We are talking about God's promises to those back then and also how they are meant for us today. Have a great weekend!

#### **Mrs. Himanen:**

We had a terrific week settling into new routines, trying new activities, and learning more about trees. We "adopted" a deciduous tree which we named "Mable" and a coniferous tree which we named "Ryan". (The class brought forth the names and voted on them) We enjoyed playing fun games in the gym and even had a "skating party" and a "snowball fight"!

Thank you to those who have been able to bring in tree books and items! We have been having fun collecting and pressing leaves and will soon learn how to identify the trees they came from.

Library books came home today. The grade twos are allowed to take out 2 books each week and the grade threes are allowed to take out 3 books. Please remember that library is on Wednesdays, so books need to be returned that day.

### **Grades 3 & 4 – Miss deHaan**

Work folders come home today with new Word Wall Words. A Memory Work sheet was sent home last week and will be due this Wednesday (testing is completed orally). We have been practicing it faithfully at school all week and it is coming home for reinforcement.

NB. Please get in the habit of asking your child if they have any unfinished work in their backpacks at the end of the day. If they did not complete an assignment, it will be sent home to avoid getting behind. Please help them to be responsible and return the completed assignment the next day.

Highlights this week:

- Bible: We continued to learn about the beginning of creation with sin entering the world and the effects it has had in the world. We also discussed how God used Noah as a second beginning after the flood. Despite being a person who loves God and tries to serve Him, he is still sinful and made some bad choices
- Social Studies: We are continuing to learn about Canada. We began reviewing the region of the Appalachians in the Maritimes.
- Math Grade 3: We have continued to strengthen our skills of addition and subtraction in sequences. We began to learn about pattern rules.
- Literature: We read a story,  pudding Like a Night on the Sea. Two boys disobey their father and eat all the pudding made for their mother. They discover that they must make amends by fixing the problem they created – they must make a new batch immediately before mother comes home!
- Computers: We have been practicing our spelling words and typing skills. Usernames and passwords have come home for both spellingcity.com and typing club.

**Mrs. Himanen:**

We had another terrific week together learning and setting routines in the classroom! Congratulations to the grade fives for successfully completing their first math test of the year! We continue to study patterns and their use in solving mathematical problems.

In Literature we continued learning about how to maintain peace and read a story about 2 brothers who, in their zeal to outdo each other, caused the destruction of both their kingdoms.

In grammar we studied nouns, sentences, and alphabetical order and will review proper nouns and capitalization next week.

**Mr. Himanen:**

Social Studies: Next week the class will be studying the structure of our governments. We will look at the municipal, provincial, and the federal governments and how they are similar and/or different in their responsibilities.

Bible: The class is studying some of the last kings of Judah and looking at how they were either faithful or unfaithful kings. We will also study how God judged each of them.

Science: The class will be looking at how light travels and how we can 'turn' light from its straight line path. We will be learning about the Law of Reflection.

Grade 6 Math: The class will be having a quiz next week on Thursday. The quiz will be on Finding and recognizing patterns in numbers.

**Mrs. Hawkins:**

Music- Students sang worship songs and reviewed note reading.

**Grades 7 & 8 - Mrs. Voortman, Mr. Himanen, Mrs. Hawkins**

**Mrs. Voortman:**

Grade 8 Math: We did a review of order of operations including exponents and solved problems with up to five steps. I am amazed at how well the students remembered this from last year. We started a study on integers (positive and negative numbers). We learned a neat trick for subtracting integers and covered addition and multiplication as well. Next week we will work on division and then will try solving order of operations problems including integers.

Bible: We continued to look at God's Story as a big picture. We discussed symbols and how emotions can often be symbolized using weather or by colours. We are choosing colours that will help us remember the big picture of God's story (ie black for sin, red for redemption). I love the enthusiasm of this bunch and the wonderful discussions we have been having. Keep it up! We also finished our Grow Group posters and met with our Grow Groups for the first time on Wednesday. Our class has a big responsibility being leaders of the groups this year and have already met the challenge with energy and excitement.

Literature: We looked at the characteristics of a short story and were able to identify most of them on our own. In Through the Tunnel Jerry made a decision that most of us agreed we wouldn't have made. We will continue to explore the decisions being made in various short stories next week. We had a fantastic time Wednesday with our new reading buddies (the grade one class). We loved having one on one time with these little ones, just being able to read to them.

Writing: We have identified the three main categories for our biographies and have begun compiling a list of interview questions for the classmate we will be writing about. We chose a name out of a hat to see who would be the subject of our biography. Next week we will conduct our interviews and start the rough draft.

**Mr. Himanen:**

Science: The students will be learning more about solutions next week and growing an alum crystal from their super-saturated solutions.

History: The class is learning about how the British are governing the colony after their defeat of the French in Quebec.

Grade 7 Math: The class will be continuing to review some the skills that were learned in the previous year. We are multiplying and dividing and solving different word problems.

**Mrs. Hawkins:**

Grade 7 Music: Students reviewed basic theory in preparation for their upcoming instrument instruction.

Grade 9/10 – Mrs. Voortman, Mr. Himanen, Mrs. Hawkins

**Mrs. Voortman:**

Bible: We continued our study of A Case for Faith by Lee Strobel. We specifically looked at the question why does God allow suffering? We delved into Scripture and had some great discussion surrounded this topic. We also had our first experience in mentoring a Grow Group team.

**Mr. Himanen:**

Science- Next week the class will be learning about the nitrogen cycle and how it works in nature. We will also look at how this and the other cycles are impacted by human activities and the subsequent effect that the cycles have on our environment.

**Mrs. Hawkins:**

ENG 9/10: We read up to chapter 5 in To Kill a Mockingbird. We discussed the narrator's point of view and learned about Maycomb's townsfolk and economy.
